2+2 SCHOLARSHIP



ARE YOU FROM LATIN AMERICA OR THE CARIBBEAN?

You may be eligible for our 2+2 Scholarship! Once you complete 60 credit hours or an Associate of Arts certificate (AA) at FSU Republic of Panama Campus, you can transition to our main campus and pay instate tuition, saving about \$60,000.



To qualify, you need to:

- Be from a Latin American or Caribbean country. *
- Be officially admitted as an FSU degree-seeking student.
- Complete 60 credit hours at FSU Panama, to include the CoreFSU courses (accelerated credits such as IB, AP, CLEP, or transfer credits are not included in the 60 hours).
- Have at least a 3.0 cumulative FSU GPA when you change campus and keep it during your studies at the main campus.

*Only eligible countries. Eligible Latin American and Caribbean countries and territories are: Anguilla, Antigua and Barbuda, Argentina, Aruba, Bahamas, Barbados, Belize, Bermuda, Bolivia, Brazil, British Virgin Islands, Caribbean Netherlands, Cayman Islands, Chile, Colombia, Costa Rica, Cuba, Curacao, Dominica, Dominican Republic, Ecuador, EL Salvador, Falkland Islands, French Guiana, Grenada, Guadaloupe, Guatemala, Guyana, Haiti, Honduras, Jamaica, Martinique, Mexico, Montserrat, Nicaragua, Panama, Paraguay, Peru, Puerto Rico, St. Barthelemy, St. Kitts and Nevis, St. Lucia, St. Maarten/St. Martin, St. Vincent and the Grenadines, Suriname, Trinidad and Tobago, Turks and Caicos Islands, Uruguay, U.S. Virgin Islands, and Venezuela.

FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE FOR U.S. CITIZENS

The following financial support options are available to eligible U.S. citizens and can be used towards the FSU Panama cost of attendance:

- Federal Financial Aid (FAFSA)*
- Florida Bright Futures Scholarship
- Florida Pre-Paid (FPP)
- Veterans benefits

Dual citizens (U.S. and Panama) may also be eligible to request an IFARHU loan or apply for an IFARHU scholarship for both FSU Panama and FSU main campus tuition/fees.

Additionally, FSU Panama offers an installment plan, allowing students to pay their semester tuition in three or four portions.

*Students must be admitted as degree-seeking to qualify.

Non-Florida U.S. citizens may qualify for "Florida Residency" for tuition purposes when transferring from the FSU Republic of Panama Campus to the main campus in Tallahassee, Florida. Eligibility requires living in the Republic of Panama and attending FSU Panama for at least 12 consecutive months, along with formal admission as a degree-seeking student prior to the transfer semester.

FRESHMAN APPLICANTS

1. Apply for Admission:

- Visit panama.fsu.edu to apply and pay the non-refundable USD \$30.00 application fee with \$70.00 processing fee.

2. Submit the Following Documents:

- **Official Transcripts:** Provide official transcripts from the last four years of high school. If they are not issued in English, include a certified English translation.
- High School Diploma: Submit a copy of your diploma.
- **3. English Proficiency Test Scores:** Official English Language Proficiency results are required of all international applicants whose native language is not English. You can self-report your official test scores and upload the official results.
 - TOEFL iBT test: 80
 - TOEFL iBT ® Home Edition: 80
 - Duolingo: 120
 - International English Language Testing System (Academic IELTS): 6.5
 - Cambridge C1 Advanced Level or C2 Proficiency: 180
 - Pearson Test of English (PTE): 55
 - Michigan Language Assessment (MLA): 55
 - Test Score Submission: For the iBT TOEFL, send your scores directly to FSU (code 5203).
 - **Exemption:** Citizens of countries where English is the official language are exempt from the TOEFL or IELTS but must attach a copy of their passport to their application.

4. Official SAT or ACT Scores:

- If you have already taken the SAT or ACT, request your scores to be sent directly to FSU (SAT code: 5219, ACT code: 0734).
- If you haven't taken the SAT or ACT, you can still enroll at FSU Panama, but you must take one of these exams during your first or second semester of enrollment.

TRANSFER APPLICANTS

In addition to the freshman admission requirements, transfer applicants must also submit the following:

Official Transcripts:

- Submit transcripts from each college or university attended.
- If transcripts are in a language other than English, include a certified English translation.

Course-by-Course Evaluation:

- Provide an official course-by-course evaluation of all academic records from each non-U.S. college or university attended (transfer credit from non-U.S. universities will not be awarded without this evaluation).
- We recommend using any of the evaluating agencies listed at naces.org or ies.aacrao.org.

WORK-STUDY PROGRAM

Students who are enrolled full time and have a cumulative GPA of 2.75 or above, could be eligible to work part-time for a minimum of 15 hours to a maximum of 20 hours per week, in FSU Panama departments like the Laboratories, Reception, Marketing, Math Learning Center, Library, Bookstore, and English Language Program. Students in the program receive payment for the amount of hours worked during any given semester.

HOUSING

FSU Panama offers on-campus housing at the "FSU Residence Hall", which is within walking distance to all academic facilities and to all the service venues of the City of Knowledge which include a food court, cafes, convenience stores, drugstore, a health clinic, and more.

FSU offers exclusive transportation for dorm students that is available within specific class schedules. Students also enjoy free parking at both the residence hall and at our main building.
